#### **USO Food Deliveries and Support for July**

Arlington-Fairfax Elks Lodge #2188's support for the local USOs and military/veteran members continues. The July delivery of food to both the Reagan National Airport USO and to the USO facility at Joint Base Myer/Henderson Hall was met with thanks, smiles, and accolades.

Eleven boxes of frozen food/sandwiches were delivered to USO Reagan National Airport, which will serve 150 military/veteran members. Thirteen boxes of frozen food/sandwiches and 2 boxes of frozen treats were delivered to the Ft. Myer Honor Guard USO and will serve 230 there.

Additionally, our Lodge provided hotel rooms for 4 military travelers, who were stranded at Reagan National when their flights were cancelled. For these young travelers, who are on their way to boot camp and may be as young as 17, this is often their first flight, first time away from home, and first time on their own. A very scary time and one in which they have no idea what to do. We are proud to help these young military members as they begin their military service. **[PER Patti Graves]**


