A Reminder to All Members: It is required that we follow Grand Lodge Statutes when bringing guests into our Lounge area. News from the Scholarships Committee (Susan Mekenney, Chairman)

Every year our Lodge participates in the Elks National Foundation "Most Valuable Student Scholarship Contest." This year, out of about 30 applicants, we chose three girls and three boys that we awarded \$1,000. They were:

All 6 students were pushed to District where all three girls made it to State. Hana, the Auxiliary Scholarship recipient and Tiffany went on to National where they were one of 480 5th Place runners up receiving \$4,000 scholarships spread out over four years. Katherine was one of 16 students receiving a \$1,000 state scholarship from the State Elks organization. As of this writing, Legacy Scholarships have not yet been awarded. So, stay tuned. Our Lodge may be the beneficiary of yet another one or two scholarships.

News from the Trustees (Diane Kaplon, Chairman)



The Board welcomes new member Rick Hudson. Rick brings a fresh perspective and has many great ideas for Lodge improvements. The Board completed the draft budget for our new fiscal year that went to the floor at the last meeting in April. Thanks to everyone that contributed to the budget process. Now that we are on more stable financial ground, the Board is prioritizing the long list of projects and deferred maintenance. The HVAC system, roof and downstairs bathrooms are high on the list, along with removing a dead tree and fixing the RV electrical, both of which are possible safety concerns. Many members have emailed ideas on how to make the Lodge safer, more accessible and more appealing, in general. The Board is

also working on further improvements to the Club operations. Club revenue is up over \$100,000 from the prior year and Club Manager Santiago is working with the staff and vendors to keep our costs down and reduce waste. USO Food Deliveries at Reagan National Airport

Elks Lodge #2188 continues to assist the USO Center with new and continuing initiatives. We support the Reagan National Airport USO with multiple monthly deliveries of frozen food to fill their freezer with hearty food/sandwiches for the traveling military/veterans. In December 2018, Exalted Ruler Laurie Fearis and other members from our Lodge presented a check for \$5,000 to

USO Manager Marty Jennings. The Reagan USO will be moving to a new and larger space at the airport in late summer. These funds will help the Center purchase items to make the new space more like home for the traveling military, veterans and their families, with items including chairs, a new TV and/or freezer. Additionally, #2188 members **Lisa & Michael Stevens** generously donated 60 boxes of Girl Scout cookies for the USO Center to provide USO visitors with a sweet, tasty treat. This was also a great way to support another great organization, namely the Girl Scouts. That is a win-win. Finally, our Lodge was asked by USO Manager Marty Jennings to assist with a new program they were hoping to initiate that would provide a hotel room for any stranded military member. With the many weather-related issues and the frequent unexpected flight issues that have stranded many fliers, it was a concern that many military members may have to spend a sleepless, very uncomfortable night at the airport. Reagan basically shuts down services in the late evening when flights are no longer allowed, due to sound-level restrictions. A local Hyatt hotel, with shuttle service, agreed to provide rooms for the stranded military, at a reasonable cost. **Our Lodge partnered with the USO and Hyatt on this new initiative and is providing the necessary funds.** To date, #2188 is proud to have provided a hotel stay for approximately 8 military members and some spouses. This program is expected to grow as flight delays continue.





#2188 Supports Bingo at Martinsburg VA Hospital

Four members of #2188 made the 140-mile round trip to host bingo for the veterans at the VA Hospital in Martinsburg, West Virginia. It was a fun night with one of our best attendance records. Over 60 patients attended the bingo games and almost all stayed for the entire program. With movie night at the hospital the same night and free popcorn being offered, we expected to lose many of our players. But they hung with us until the end, thus

showing that they really enjoy our games and the Canteen Books that we give out as

prizes. It is also evident how much they enjoy browsing through the other items we bring, such as back-scratchers, playing cards, puzzles, books, and the like, where they can choose as many items as they want for free. Finally, as an extra thank you for their service and a thank you for joining us, we gave each veteran two Canteen Coupon Books before they left. IT IS ALMOST TIME FOR CAMPING SEASON

It's hard to believe that we are getting ready for another camping season at the Virginia Elks Youth Camp. For our newer members this is one of our major state projects and each year we send deserving youth from our community to camp for a week. This year the girls go July 7 to July13, and the boys go July 21 to July 27. As our Lodge membership has dropped so has the quota of campers we are asked to send. While we sent close to 50 campers about 10 years ago, this year our quota is only 24. Believe it or not, parents and school counselors have already approached me asking for available slots, so I know those 24 slots are going to be used up quickly. I would like to see us send more than our quota. The camp has the space but doing so increases the cost to the Lodge. If you would like to sponsor all or part of the tuition for a camper, the cost is \$150 per camper. This would allow us to serve more children in the community. Later, I will be looking for chaperones to accompany the kids to and from the camp. This is a nice way to see the Elks Youth Camp, which is about a 4-hour drive and located near Clifton Forge in southwest Virginia. Our Lodge has always been one of the biggest supporters of the camp. 
