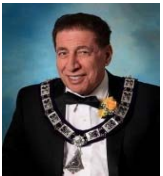

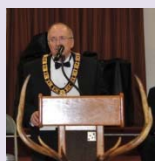

As I begin my third year as Chairman, the real fun begins! We have so much work to do this year and not enough time or money to do it. All the Trustees are still working full-time, which makes scheduling additional meetings very difficult. As I stated in last month's article, we have lots of work to do. We must complete the review of our room rentals, develop plans for fixing our leaking roof, installing handicap accessible doors, upgrading the Point-of-Sale computer system, and giving the Ballroom (which is a major source of revenue) a fresh look. We also need to develop a comprehensive pro-active maintenance schedule for our facility, a cohesive and expanded communication strategy to both our members and the Arlington-Fairfax Elks community at large and, of course, improving our overall financial standing. Of course, our top priority is developing a new staffing plan in preparation for Tom's announced retirement in the October timeframe. As such, I have made the decision to change how the Board meetings are conducted. The Board has met on the 1st and 3rd Tuesday of the month and, in the past, has followed a format like the Lodge meeting (i.e., Old Business, New Business and Good of the Order along with some other management reporting). Starting the first meeting in May, we will change the format of 1st meeting of the month to more of a Project Management working session. If there are new business matters that need to be addressed (such as a request for funds), they will be addressed either at the beginning of the meeting or via email. This goal here is to give the Board members the time needed to formulate and act on plans that are critical to the Lodge's continued success. The 2nd Board meeting of the month will continue in the structured format of the past. This will include in-depth financial reporting (P&L statements, revenue projections), Old Business, New Business, and a review and reporting of Board Action items. **SAVE THE DATE:** LODGE CLEANUP DAY -- Saturday, May 20th, beginning at 8:30A until about 1:00P-2:00P. It is hard to believe that we are getting ready for another camping season at the Virginia Elks Youth Camp. For our newer members, this is one of our major State projects and each year we send deserving youth from our community to camp for a week. This year, the girls go July 2- 8, and the boys go July 16-22. As our Lodge membership has dropped, so has the quota of campers we are asked to send. While we sent close to 50 campers about 10 years ago, this year our quota is only 27. Believe it or not, I have already been approached by parents and counselors from the schools asking for spots, so I know those 28 slots are going to be used up quickly. I would like to see us send more than our quota. The camp has the space, but doing so increases the cost to the Lodge. **If you would like to sponsor all (or part) of the tuition for a camper, the cost is \$150 per camper.** This would allow us to serve more children in

the community. Many of you may remember that last year's Camper of the Year was one of the boys we were able to send over our quota due to the generosity of our members. At a later time I will be looking for chaperones to accompany to kids to and from camp. This is a nice way to see the camp, which is about a 4-hour drive and located near Clifton Forge in southwest Virginia. Our Lodge has always been one of the biggest supporters of the camp. Let's keep it up this year and surpass our own performance!
