
Meetings

BOARD OF TRUSTEES (Steve Thiebaut, Chairman 2020-2021)



The Board is looking forward reopening our Lodge on a limited basis as soon as Saturday May 30, 2020 as part of the Northern Virginia transition to Phase One, joining the rest of the state in easing coronavirus restrictions. As we begin to reopen our doors, our primary concern is the health and safety of our employees, customers, and members. Like most Lodges and small businesses, we are closely monitoring the latest information provided by the Centers of Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and our local government officials, and we are adapting our plans to reflect the updated guidelines and evolving situation of COVID-19.

Since closing the Lodge back in March, we have been working hard to complete several projects in the member social quarters and hope you will come out and see the Lodge improvements firsthand. We are hopeful and optimistic things will return to "normal" soon. Please follow all the recommended COVID-19 guidelines and know that we always value your questions, ideas, and feedback. GUIDELINES FOR LODGE E-BLASTS (ELECTRONIC NEWS FLASHES)

In order to simplify sending notices to our members online concerning Club and Lodge events, and to end confusion from misinformation being sent, we have put the following procedures in place: (1) One person per event should be designated as the "spokesperson" and that person should contact the Secretary of the Lodge (Jan Sullivan) concerning the eblast, with a copy to Rose Thiebaut; (2) The request needs to be written out completely and accurately and then sent to the Secretary as soon as the event is scheduled and marked on the Lodge calendar, and the details are in place; (3) The Secretary (or Rose Thiebaut in Jan's absence) will respond to the spokesperson that the message has been received. If there is no response within a 24-hour period, please call; (4) The Secretary and her press team will be the only ones responsible for getting the message out. The event organizers are responsible for coordinating with the Exalted Ruler, the Club Manager, and the House and Entertainment Committees concerning staffing, food, times, etc.; and (5) If there is a change, the Secretary should be notified as quickly as possible with the new details.

The Exalted Ruler is the head or President of the Lodge and oversees all the work done by the Committees and members. The duties of the Exalted Ruler are more fully given in Article V, Section 2 of our Bylaws. The Esteemed Leading Knight is to serve as the backup to the Exalted Ruler. The duties of the other officers are defined in Sections 4 and 5.

The Trustees are to oversee the maintenance of the building and grounds. Their further duties are also provided in Section 6 of the Bylaws. The Board of Trustees' actions are all subject to the control of the Lodge membership. Each year, one Trustee is elected for a five-year term. This provides for continuity on the Board of Trustees.

COVID-19 continues to raise havoc with our golf schedule. We had to cancel our first five events --Bristow Manor (April 6), Old Hickory (April 20), Prince William (May 4), Forest Greens (May 18) and Hidden Creek (June 1). Next on the list is Bull Run on June 15. We are hoping to celebrate "opening day" at Bull Run. Current trends seem to be encouraging depending on whom you listen to. This is being written on May 15. We have another event scheduled for June 29 at 1757. Two events are scheduled for July at Pleasant Valley on the 13th and Heritage Hunt on the 27th. Shotgun starts are

planned for all. Normal sign-up procedures will apply. Golf Association members will receive a reminder email a week prior with pertinent instructions. Basically, they will need to respond by the Thursday preceding the Monday event with required information. Since we have already lost almost a third of our schedule, the Golf Committee decided we should not have a membership fee this year. So, any Elk who wants to join can do so at no expense. It is our "coronavirus special" - however, you will need to either submit the membership form or provide basic information (i.e. email address, home address and phone number) to Ron Murphy at the address or phone number provided above.) Those members who had already joined have received a refund.


