The 2022 Golf Association Schedule is complete and available. Copies of it and the 2022 Membership Application have been provided to the Association members and are available to any other interested parties from Ron Murphy at bettyron.50@gmail.com or by calling 703 866-4403. Some copies also are available at the Lodge on the Golf Association bulletin board.

Our season kicks off at Pohick Bay on April 4th. Also, in April we will play at Old Hickory on the 18th. We play Prince William on May 2, Forest Greens on the 16th, and Hidden Creek on the 31st. In June we will be at Bull Run on the 13th, and 1757 on the 27^{th.} On July 11, we play at Pleasant Valley and Heritage Hunt on the 25th. In August, we play at Penderbrook on the 8th and Raspberry Falls on the 22nd. We will play at Reston National on September 12, and our 2022 Masters Tournament will be held at Forest Greens on the 26th. Arlington-Fairfax #2188 Volunteers Provide Support to Local USO's

The Arlington-Fairfax #2188 member volunteers stepped up in March 2023 to support the local USO Centers. We were asked to help organize and provide the food for 400 Army soldiers who were completing 3 weeks of vigorous training at Joint Base Myer/Henderson Hall (Ft. Myer). This training for the MedCom/Infantry/Regiment soldiers was an opportunity for the participating soldiers to earn E38 badges. The food our Lodge provided for their Chow event gave these soldiers their first quality meal since the training exercises began and was prior to their graduation ceremony. Our Lodge members did not disappoint by donating hundreds of cookies, brownies, and bars to be used for dessert. Additionally, 14 members volunteered to set up, organize and serve the food - which consisted of pork barbecue sandwiches, coleslaw, chips, drinks, and the donated cookies. It was evident that the soldiers were hungry, tired, and very grateful for a good meal. Following the event, the leftover food was taken back to the Ft. Myer USO facility and helped serve an additional 100 hungry Marines.

Arlington-Fairfax #2188 members also continued their usual monthly support of the USOs at Reagan National Airport and Ft. Myer, with frozen food deliveries. Twelve boxes of hearty frozen food that can be easily microwaved were delivered to Reagan and 13 boxes were delivered to Ft. Myer. The USO managers continuously tell us how our Lodge's support is essential to their facilities. The Reagan USO manager was unable to meet us at Reagan when we delivered food, so she made sure she came to Ft. Myer to thank us personally for our support. Thank you to all our members who donate to help make this program and the USO support possible!


VEA YOUTH CAMP FUNDRAISER at #2188 - Held on Saturday, March 11, 2023
