Our Lodge Environment

How is our Lodge environment? We appear to enjoy each other in the club, but is everyone really comfortable? By now, I'm sure we all have had some form of sexual abuse training at work. Abuse does not have to be sexual. Any action that makes someone feel uncomfortable can be considered as an abuse. The language we use and the tone of voice we speak in can be abusive. Belittling comments, even jokes can be abusive. If we stand in someone's personal space and continue to talk after that person has indicated that they do not want to have a

conversation can be considered abusive. Abuse is not a question about what we intend. It is a question about how it makes the other person feel. All abuse causes a lack of trust and builds resentment. This contributes to a hostile environment, and makes it harder for everyone to perform their functions and enjoy their time participating in the Elks Lodge. What can you do to improve our Lodge environment? First, be aware of your effect on other Lodge members. Do people avoid talking to you and working with you? Are people uncomfortable being around you? If so, you may have a problem relating to that person. Look at your behavior. Are you doing something the other person could consider to be abuse? You cannot change the way your behavior makes the other person feel. To improve the relationship and environment, you must first identify the problem, then your behavior to correct it.

LOCATION, LOCATION! Have you heard the rumor that the Board is trying to sell the property? Let me put an end to this rumor here and now. **Absolutely not!** We have no intentions of selling this property. We sit on 5+ acres of prime Fairfax County real estate and it is NOT for sale. Every month I get emails about other Lodges. Usually, these emails have to do with declining membership or financial distress, and the different actions other lodges are taking to address the issue. These actions range from a lodge is closing, or a lodge is merging with another lodge, or a lodge has partnered with a developer to

generate a new revenue stream and, sometimes, get a new lodge building as part of the deal. Those who know me know I am always looking for ways to generate new revenue streams and improve our Lodge's overall financial position. I was told that a few years ago there were developers interested in developing this property. So we have made some initial high-level inquiries to see if there is any interest from either commercial or residential developers in our property. If a developer expresses interest, then we will consider creating a partnership with the developer that is mutually beneficial. As I stated, these are initial high-level inquiries -- that is all. If we get any interest, we will create a committee of legal, financial, and member representatives to ensure any decisions made are made in the best interest our Lodge and our members. This is not something that is going to happen overnight, but is a long-term (multiple year) project. Rest assured that the Board is aware of your concerns and will act in the best interest of this Lodge and of the members. [Chairman Roy Seabolt]
