VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES -- The Backpack Lunch Program is an important charity serving at-risk children in Fairfax County. Please consider volunteering to co-chair (or chair) this committee to ensure that it continues to help hungry children throughout the 2019-2020 school year. The committee meets from 5:30P-6:30P in the Lounge once a month on a Wednesday to pack lunches (the date is announced by news flash). Approximately 10-15 volunteers are needed each month to help set up and pack lunches. Two volunteers with a van or SUV are needed or approximately 1 hour (any time between 10:00A and 1:30P) to deliver the lunches to Daniels Run Elementary School in Fairfax. Volunteers are also welcomed to organize

food drives at their church, workplace or other organization to collect donations of food and/or grocery store gift cards. <u>NOTE</u>: All food items must be individual-sized and, if they require heating, must be in microwavable packaging. Please check expiration dates since the school cannot accept expired items. The food items needed each month (100 of each):

- shelf stable milk (any flavor)
- fruit cups
- individual size cereal boxes or bowls
- individual size mac n cheese
- Cup-O-Soup or other brand individual soup cups
- chips, popcorn or pretzels

- snack crackers filled with cheese or peanut butter
- individual packets of microwavable oatmeal
- Nutra-Grain Bars or other breakfast bars
- individual size bowls of beefaroni or Spaghetti-O's
- other snack items like fruit snacks, pudding cups, raisins


