#### IT IS ALMOST TIME FOR CAMPING SEASON

It's hard to believe that we are getting ready for another camping season at the Virginia Elks Youth Camp. For our newer members this is our major state project and each year we send deserving youth from our community to camp for a week. This year the girls go July 5 to July 11 and the boys go July 19 to July 25. If you know of any child, ages 8-13 who would benefit from this week of camp, please contact me at 571-203-0375 for more information or an application packet. I will be contacting the schools the middle of April. The Lodge provides transportation to and from camp and there is no cost to the child or their family.

As our Lodge membership has dropped so has the quota of campers we are asked to send. While we sent close to 50 campers about 10 years ago, this year our quota is only 28. Believe it or not, I have already been approached by parents and counselors from the schools asking for spots so I know those 28 slots are going to be used up quickly. I would like to see us send more than our quota. The camp has the space but doing so increases the cost to the Lodge. If you would like to serve more children in the tuition for a camper, the cost is per camper is \$150. This would allow us to serve more children in the community.

At a later time I will be looking for chaperones to accompany to kids to and from camp. This is a nice way to see the camp which is about a 4 hour drive and located near Clifton Forge in southwest Virginia.

Our Lodge has always been one of the biggest supporters of the camp.. Let's keep it up this year and surpass our own performance!

## **Golf Update**

We kick off the golf season this month on the  $6^{th}$  at Westpark. Also, this month we will play at Old Hickory on the  $20^{th}$ . Osprey Landing on the  $4^{th}$  and Prince William on the  $18^{th}$  are scheduled for May. All will have 0900 shotgun starts.

We will continue to use the sign up procedures introduced last year. Under these procedures players will be contacted, by email, a week before with instructions for that event. The easiest way to sign up is just respond to that email: hit reply, add your information, and send. If you don't do email, you can sign up by phone. When you want to play with a particular person or group, include that information in your response/phone call. You should coordinate with them first. Sign up must be accomplished by the Thursday preceding the day of the event.

When you play, you should report to the golf course at least 30 minutes prior to the tee time (usually 9:00) and pay your green fee in the pro shop. Next report to the golf committee desk, pay a \$3 fee, get your hole assignment, buy 50/50 tickets (optional) and receive any pertinent instructions for that day's play. You should be at your cart and ready to play fifteen minutes before the tee time to receive instructions from the course representative and/or the tournament director, witness the 50/50 drawing (collect winnings??) and be ready to go.

All Lodge 2188 members are invited to join the Golf Association. Lodge members who choose not to join may play as guests.
