IMPORTANT NEWS!

Infrastructure Update

In the last week of February 2016, the long-awaited **Infrastructure Upgrade** project was completed. This project included a phone system replacement, an upgrade and expansion of the Lodge's Wi-Fi network, and an upgrade in the TV service.

<u>Phone System</u> – The phone system has been updated to utilize the latest business phone system technology, and the key point here is that now there is a **single phone number** to call for your Lodge business which is **(703) 560-2188**. All of the other numbers have been retired, so that when you call the Lodge, please listen to the **updated menu options** (and yes, our menu options have changed).

<u>Wi-Fi</u> – The internet service has been upgraded to provide triple the speed/bandwidth of the old Wi-Fi network. Additionally, the entire building has been wired to provide Wi-Fi connectivity throughout the building, not just the bar area. There will be two new Wi-Fi networks, Elks-Members and Elks-Guest. The old Elks2188 Wi-Fi will be retired. Network logon information will be available at the bar. <u>Note</u>: For members who have smart phones that support Wi-Fi calling, this new network will allow you to make and receive calls throughout the building if you enable the function on your phone.

<u>TV Service</u> – The TV service has been upgraded to a new digital service with access to the Local broadcast channels, the College Sports network, and the Professional Sports network.

Year-End Update: Well, to say the least, my year as Chairman has been interesting and a definite learning experience. My goal was to maintain a steady course and to that end we were successful. While we were not able to accomplish as much as I would have liked due to our continuing financial constraints, we were able to deal with the emergencies, such as two broken water pipes, heating/cooling issues in the Ballroom, and repair to the leaking roof in the Ballroom. We were also able to complete the long overdue infrastructure upgrade with a new phone system, a Wi-Fi network

throughout the building, and digital TV service.

The next year, we will continue to experience the financial stress that has been present for the past several years. We will start the new fiscal year performing a complete financial and operation review to see if there is any place where we can reduce expenses, improve reporting, and prioritize repairs to the Lodge. We will also be initiating a marketing effort to local businesses in an attempt to increase our daytime hall rentals and, thus, improve our revenue streams.

Finally, we will continue to look for new ways to improve our long-term financial viability. This is where you (the members of this Lodge) come in. Please, if you have suggestions on programs that may move us in that direction, share your ideas with a Board member. Let me give you an example. In the last month, two different members approached me and suggested that we setup a Legacy Endowment Fund. Now, this is something I do not know anything about, but I know three members who do, so we are putting together a working group to explore this possibility to see if it is something we should implement. Before this encounter, I never even thought about Endowments, but because two members suggested it, it is something we are looking into. Do you have any suggestions? [Board Chairman Roy Seabolt]


THE DICTIONARY PROJECT



The Dictionary Project has been a great success this year and every year since we started using the Gratitude Grant to fund it. Special thanks to the dedicated people on our committee, Tim & Georgianna Knotts, Pat Graves and Barbara Marshall. We gave out over 1,000 dictionaries to third graders in eleven Fairfax County elementary schools. I have been doing the original six schools along Franconia Road with help from other Elks for the last five years. Unfortunately, Fredi and I will be moving to Florida the first week of April, and I will no longer be able to deliver dictionaries to those schools. While the other committee members will take over the project

after I depart the area, they will need help in distributing dictionaries to those six schools, two of which are classified as Title I (with students who are in the most need). The other schools also have kids in need, as well, and our free dictionaries help them learn and understand the English language better. To keep our program going, I ask that Lodge members (especially those of you who just joined in the last year or so and are looking for ways to help) either contact me by email ken.hensley@cox.net or by telephone at (703) 644-1149, and leave a message if I don't answer. I will forward your names to the Dictionary Project Committee, and they will contact and invite you to future committee meetings to plan for dictionary delivery next fall. Without your help, we may have to cut some of the schools I have been delivering to, and that would be a shame, as those kids really benefit from our program. Remember our motto – "Elks Share-Elks Care!"
