# Message from Exalted Ruler James Weed



In 1868 a group of actors were talking one day after practice. They had a problem. Sunday was the only day they all had off and they wanted some place to meet and socialize. The problem, due to Blue Laws, alcohol could not be sold on Sundays. Without alcohol sales, it wasn't profitable to open the bars and clubs. All bars and clubs were closed on Sunday. One of the actors remembered that he had a friend who was a member of a private club and it was open and could serve alcohol on Sundays. The solution to their problem, form a private club. Soon the club was open. They had a place to meet and enjoy each other's company. There was always something to talk about -- politics, sports, tales about work, and what each other had done. Soon other actors began to join the club and the good times and fellowship continued. As time ran on, the club members got older. One day a member passed away. He was missed.

The club members remembered him and told stories of his actions and good traits. One of the members realized that he had a wife who was having a hard time dealing with her husband's death and the loss of his income. The discussion turned to what the club could do help. Plans were made, funds raised, and support was given. In later conversations, the club members discovered that as much as they enjoyed the club and its fellowship, that helping the wife of their departed member really made them feel good. The question was asked: "Why not help others?" The club now had two cardinal principles -- fellowship and service. As time moved on, the club grew to include more than actors and expander into other towns, cities and states. For !50 years we still have that private club. Today it is called the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks. Let the celebration begin. ## #2188 Supports Bingo at Martinsburg, WV Veterans Hospital in 2017

On the 5th Friday of a month, our Lodge, with support from the Annandale Knights of Columbus, hosts Bingo at the Veterans Affairs Hospital in Martinsburg, WV. During these visits in 2017, the hospitalized veterans are treated to a fun evening. The Bingo program begins with a "free" store, where the veterans can browse and choose from any number of items from multiple tables filled with polo/t-shirts, puzzles, back scratchers, cards, books, hand-made scarves/hats, etc. Then when Bingo begins, canteen coupon books are given as prizes. Finally, as we say goodbye to each attendee, we give them 1-2 coupon books as an additional "Thank You" for their service. The veterans can use the coupon books in the VA Hospital canteen/store to buy any number of items, including food, clothing, electronics, etc. For the 4 events that were hosted in 2017, our members donated 84 hours of time, drove almost 2,000 miles, donated \$350 in mileage/gas, and over \$1,000 worth of merchandize/items for the "free" store. The coupon books provided by the Lodge totaled \$750. This is one of our Lodge's successful major programs that supports our veterans.

### **USO Reagan National Airport Food Deliveries for 2017**



Thanks to the generous donations of Arlington-Fairfax Elks #2188 members, the frozen food deliveries to the Reagan National Airport USO continued to be made every two weeks in calendar year 2017. The total numbers of the time, cost and mileage needed to support this program are in and they are impressive! The members of #2188 donated almost 200 hours of their time and drove over a total of 2,100 miles for the 26 deliveries made this year. Through member donations and other funding, approximately \$3,000 worth of food was delivered to the USO this past year. These frozen food deliveries help ensure our traveling military and their families have a hearty meal during their travels. 
