All Hands On Deck – Fall Festival

The Arlington-Fairfax Elks Lodge is Fairfax's best kept secret, and this is not a good thing. For the past three years, I have talked about the need for the Lodge to partner with a business to get the publicity and the community involved with the Arlington-Fairfax Elks Lodge. Well, the opportunity has finally presented itself for this community outreach! Starting Thursday, October 26th and continuing through Sunday October 29th, the Arlington-Fairfax Elks Lodge and "29 Diner" will be hosting their first **Annual Fall Festival**. This family-oriented festival will be **HUGE!** This is the weekend before Halloween, so there will be all kinds of fun activities, which will include outdoor games for the kids, face-painting, outdoor movies at night, a Halloween costume contest for the kids on Sunday, trick-or-treating for the kids, and other such fun. There will also be a Haunted House with spook characters. Can you imagine, 2000 people coming to our Lodge 3 or 4 times a year? The "29 Diner" is very active in the community and has several charitable causes that they support. These include support for Veterans, providing food and warm clothing for families in need, and are big supporters of police and fire personnel, and so much more. Their charitable acts closely align with those of our Lodge. A percentage of the net proceeds will go towards supporting both "29 Diner" and the Lodge's charitable programs.
