Thanks to Karen Bender's leadership & Fredi Hensley's assistance, our Lodge was awarded another Grant – the \$2,000 Promise Grant to be used for a new program called Backpack Lunches. What a great new initiative for children! Also, a big Thank You to all who helped out at the August Lodge clean up; and a special Shout Out to Vernon Gardener for his leadership in continuing to coordinate the project. It was clear how much work was done both outside and inside. Weeds were pulled, chairs white washed, dust bunnies eliminated and fixtures brought to shining glory. Beautiful!

Other amazing events included the 2<sup>nd</sup> annual Children's Carnival, a continuing success as a result of Brenda Slingerland's coordination and direction; the dinner for the injured soldiers from Walter Reed in partnership with the Aleethia Foundation, chaired by Linda Gardner; and 2188's annual participation in the Virginia Elks Youth Camp program, chaired by Barbara Marshall. This year we sponsored 34 campers, 5 over our Lodge quota, with one of the boys being named Camper of the Week. Other Lodge initiatives included the delicious Shots and Shooters tasting to support the Building Fund; the bus trip to Hollywood Casino; guest bartender nights by Sammy Roth (July) & Steve Thiebaut (Aug); and the on-going USO Food Deliveries, led by the 2188 Veterans Committee.

Our Ritual Team participated in the Ritual Competition at the July Grand Lodge Convention, and well-represented our State and Lodge with their performance. Also, the convention was a great success with several featured events, including the installment of John D. Amen as the Grand Exalted Ruler for 2014/2015.

A special recognition goes to our Club Mgr Tom Lotfabadi and Assistant Mgr Jay Singer. Working as a team, one of them is at the Lodge, ensuring all runs smoothly. From opening the Lodge in the wee morning hours to accommodate special meetings or for bus trip participants - to their remaining until 3-4a in the morning following a rental event -Tom & Jay are there to support the Lodge and the members - going above and beyond their job requirements!

## **Golf Update**

We are pleased to recognize our winners for the events played since the last edition of the Horn. Mack McGlumphy had the low net at South Riding with a 68, he also had the low gross, an 81. Jerry Sall had the low net at Goose Creek and Don Saboe had a low gross 80. Tim Knotts's 64 was low net at Penderbrook and Bill Timmons had the low gross, 90. Dale Crisp's net 66 was low at Pleasant Valley, his 86 was low gross. Don Saboe had both low net and gross with 63 and 75 at Virginia Oaks. Finally, Bill Timmons's net 58 was low at Westpark; Don Saboe had the low gross, 75.

The Chairman's cup race standings through Westpark are very close. Mack McGlumphy was in the lead with 24 points. Rounding out the top five scorers were Jerry Kwiatkowski and Bill Timmons with 20, Tim Knotts with 18 and Dale Crisp had 16. With a full one third of the season left, six events, virtually all Association members are still "in the running".

Two of those events are scheduled for September; The Gauntlet on the 8<sup>th</sup> and Reston on the 27<sup>th</sup>. Two more are scheduled for October; Forest Greens on the 6<sup>th</sup> and our final outing of the season, South Riding on the 20<sup>th</sup>. The 2014 Masters Tournament will be played at Reston on the 27<sup>th</sup>. All Golf Association members are eligible to compete.

All our events will have 0900 shotgun starts. If you are a Golf Association member, you will receive an email from the tournament director about a week prior with sign up instructions. The easiest way to sign up is to respond to the email. If you want to sign up as a twosome or as a group, you can do that also. Please coordinate with the other player(s). You can also sign up by phone, the applicable number will be included in the email. If you are an Elk, but not an Association member, and want to play, contact Ron Murphy at [bettyron.50@gmail.com](mailto:bettyron.50@gmail.com) or 703 866-4403. In any case sign up must be accomplished by the Thursday preceding the Monday event. Any questions regarding these procedures, the golf schedule, etc. may be directed to Ron Murphy.

When you play, report to the golf course at least 30 minutes prior to the tee time, usually 0900, and pay your green fee in the pro shop. Next, report to the golf committee desk, pay a \$3 fee, get your hole assignment, buy 50/50 tickets (optional) and receive any pertinent information for that days play. Finally, you should be at your cart and ready to play, fifteen minutes before the tee time, normally 0845, to receive instructions from the course representative and/or the tournament director, witness the 50/50 drawing and be ready to play. When you complete play, you need to get your score to Ron Murphy, either in person at the course or by phone or email. If you play with fellow Elks, one of you can take responsibility for the group. If you play with non-Elks, you must do it.

Neither the Legion, nor the Knights, has any interest in your score. If you want to get credit for playing and have your score included in the recap, you have to report it to Ron Murphy.

All Lodge members are invited to join the Golf Association. Lodge members who Choose not to join may play as guests.

Forty-seven service members, family members, and Aleethia volunteers began arriving at the Lodge about 6 PM.

These special guests enjoyed some social time before being served a succulent dinner of prime rib, baked potato, salad, asparagus, rolls and strawberry cheesecake. The meal was served by Lodge volunteers who made the service in a 5 star restaurant appear sloppy!

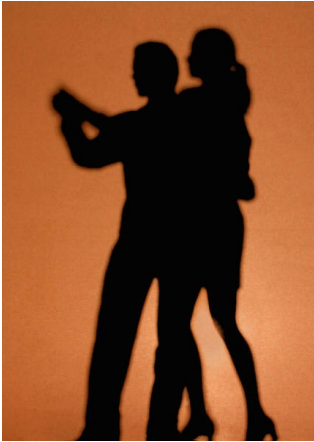

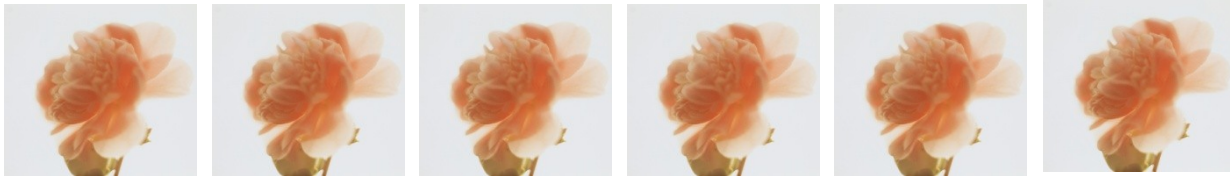

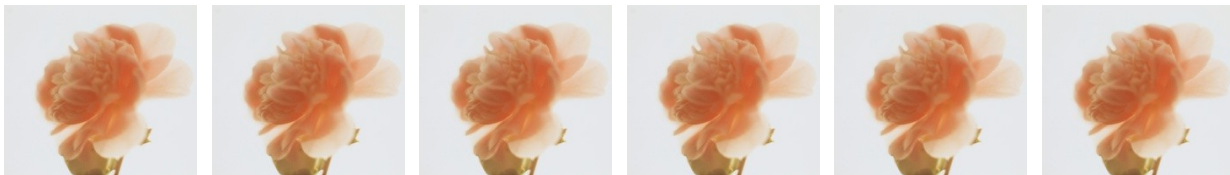
